

# **Guidance for Visiting Leisure Vessels**

**Notice is hereby given** that from 0400, 4<sup>th</sup> October 2021, new UK Government rules come into effect regarding international travel and vaccine status.

From Monday 4<sup>th</sup> October 2021, the rules for international travel to England will change from the 'traffic light' system to a single Red List of countries and simplified travel measures for arrivals from the rest of the world. The travel rules from countries not on the red list will depend on your vaccination status.

If you arrive in England before Monday 4<sup>th</sup> October, you must follow the current rules. Please see the Government's 'Red, amber and green' list rules for entering England guidance for more information.

### Travel from the rest of the world if you are fully vaccinated

From Monday 4<sup>th</sup> October 2021, if you qualify as fully vaccinated you will be required to book and pay for a <u>day 2 COVID-19 test</u>, complete a <u>Passenger Locator Form</u> and take a COVID-19 test on or before Day 2 after you arrive in England.

To qualify as fully vaccinated, you must have had a complete course of an approved vaccine at least 14 days before you arrive in England. Please see the Government's <a href="mailto:approved vaccination">approved vaccination</a> <a href="mailto:programme guidance">programme guidance</a>.

# Travel from the rest of the world if you are not fully vaccinated

Before you arrive in England you must:

- 1. Take a pre-departure COVID-19 test in the 3 days before you travel,
- 2. Book and pay for <u>Day 2 and Day 8 COVID-19 tests</u> to be taken after arrival
- 3. Complete your <u>Passenger Locator Form</u>. After you arrive in England you must quarantine for 10 days and take a COVID-19 test on day 2 and 8.

You may be able to end quarantine early if you pay for a private COVID-19 test through <u>Test to</u> Release scheme.

#### **Travel from red countries**

If you arrive in England from a Red List country, regardless of your vaccination status, you will only be allowed to enter the UK if you are a British or Irish national or have residence rights in the UK. Please see the Government's <u>Red List rules</u> for guidance on testing and quarantine.

## **International Catering Waste**

The new post Brexit rules on vessels which now includes fishing and leisure vessels carrying International Catering Waste (ICW) have now come into force.

All leisure vessels are now required to declare when they have visited another port outside of the UK so that their food and food waste (or indeed packaging or utensils with food residue), can be treated as ICW.



If your vessel has visited any non-UK port and you intend to dispose of any food or food waste (or indeed packaging or utensils with food residue), then please make Shoreham Port aware, so that necessary arrangements can be made between your vessel and Shoreham Port.

All **food or food waste** being disposed of must be double-bagged and disposed of in the Blue Bin – marked **non-UK Food Waste Category 1 By-Product For Disposal Only** by the pontoon entrance gate.

**Alternatively,** the above requirements are not required if a declaration is provided by the vessel stating that it has been completely emptied, cleaned and disinfected following its last international or EU voyage/journey by completing the attached form or by downloading via weblink below:
